The Discover Pass

The Discover Pass will be **required as of July 1** for vehicle access to recreation lands and water-access sites managed by the Washington State Parks and Recreation Commission, Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW), and Washington State Department of Natural Resources (DNR). The pass—which will be available for sale in mid-June—will cost \$30 a year per vehicle or \$10 for day-use. State recreation lands include state parks, boat launches, campgrounds, heritage sites, wildlife and natural areas, trails and trailheads.

Holders of certain types of fishing and hunting licenses, registered campers in state parks and other users are exempt from some Discover Pass requirements. For details, visit www.discoverpass.wa.gov.

Once available, the Discover Pass can be purchased at one of nearly 600 sporting goods or other retail stores that sell hunting and fishing licenses. It will also be available by calling **toll free 1-866-320-9933**, or for purchase online. Beginning next fall, the public will be able to purchase a pass when renewing a vehicle license through the Washington State Department of Licensing. The Discover Pass or day-use pass must be visibly displayed in the front windshield of any motor vehicle.

Revenue from the Discover Pass will fill budget gaps created by the loss of State General Fund support for parks and recreation on state lands. Revenue will be split among mation go to **www.Fort2FortRide.org**. Active.com will process all online registrations this year.

After the ride, join us for "RIDEFEST" in McCurdy Pavilion at Fort Worden State Park and listen to local musical talent on-stage while sipping a cool libation in our Beer Garden. This year's sponsors include: The Food Co-op, City of Port Townsend Lodging Tax Advisory Committee, Sirens Pub, Alchemy Bistro & Wine Bar, The Broken Spoke, and Arrowleaf Web Design.

This ride benefits the Friends, and supports the park as a fundraiser for projects not funded by the state parks system. These include interpretative signage, building restoration, funding of diverse activities that benefit the park and the community, and operating a park visitor information center and gift shop in the old Guardhouse.

the three state agencies that provide recreational access to state lands in proportion to their need for general fund replacement: 84 percent to State Parks; 8 percent to WDFW; and 8 percent to DNR.

State Parks, WDFW, and DNR jointly requested legislation that led to the creation of the Discover Pass, intended to provide revenue to maintain recreation access to state lands and meet the increasing demand for outdoor recreation. The legislation was sponsored by Sen. Kevin Ranker, D-San Juan Islands, who conducted stakeholder work and coordinated with other legislators. In addition to pro-

viding a stable source of revenue, the legislation provides reciprocal authority for law enforcement staff from each agency, which will improve public safety and help protect state resources.



For Fort Worden, it represents being one step closer to renovating Building 202 into a Higher Education Center! Coupled with the Community and Technical College Board's \$2,000,000 investment and the City of Port Townsend's \$500,000 contribution, this project has legs!

Jefferson County is currently underserved with regards to higher education. Peninsula College has demonstrated that there is significant demand to expand its enrollment at the Fort. In addition, Goddard College currently offers two Master of Fine Arts Programs at Fort Worden and intends to expand its presence with the addition of their Bachelor of Arts program. Old Dominion University and other educational providers have expressed interest in participating in the project to create a shared wired learning center in Building 202.

As Friends, we consider ourselves to be stewards of the natural and historic built environment at the Fort. However, we aren't antiquarians – we acknowledge that part of Fort Worden's special qualities is the energy provided by its dynamic campus, which is at its best when it is bustling with activity. The Life-Long Learning Center and the Bldg. 202 project remarkably blend the preservation of all the natural elements we value at the Fort while introducing new and exciting opportunities for our community.

Next hurdle for Building 202 is to ensure that the reconciled House/Senate Capital Budget retains the funding for the project. In this regard, we are fortunate to have a very committed legislative delegation in Olympia who are informed about the project and see its value to the community. Senator Hargrove and Representatives Tharinger and Van de Wege deserve our thanks for their extraordinary efforts to date and continuing support.

As you may be aware, the Friends have supporting this effort by providing funding for the technical assistance needed to coordinate and focus efforts in support of this project. Inclusion in the Senate Capital Budget is a significant step forward for Fort Worden and its future as a Life-Long Learning Center...and the financial support of the Friends has played a significant role in making this happen!

State Parks will be busy implementing the new Discovery Pass for collecting revenue and keeping parks and recreation lands open starting July 1, 2011. Here at Fort Worden State Park we have numerous leaseholders and businesses and are working on how to manage their employees and business supporters. According to the new law, the pass is not required for persons who have a lease or contract with State Parks.

There are day use areas in the park that will require the Discover Pass or daily parking fee. Those parking areas will have the appropriate signs and self registration envelopes for park users.

Volunteers will receive a pass for twenty four (24) hours of service on agency sanctioned volunteer projects. We hope that the supporters of Fort Worden State Parks and State Parks in general, will purchase the Discover Pass.

In April, I dedicated the Park Office's meeting room formerly known as the Blue Room to be now known as the **Jean Dunbar Room**. We honored Jean Dunbar's more than 30 years of volunteering at Fort Worden State Park in various capacities along with her more than generous support of the park and its resident organizations. Jean has become a part of Fort Worden's history and is a vital part of our volunteer program. She is currently a Board Member for the Friends

of Fort Worden and also serves as the Chair of the Advisory Committee.

The former Blue Room went through a significant transformation and historic rehabilitation. Fort Worden's incredible maintenance staff installed new energy efficient lights, tin

ceilings, new flooring (after the asbestos floor was removed) and painted. Judith Bird and Jill DeCianne worked to coordinate paint colors, furniture selections and window treatments. It is a very lovely space.

Oral History Program Wins Award

The Fort Worden Oral History Program was among the recipients of the Jefferson County Historical Society annual **Founders Day Awards** in a celebration held at the City Council Chambers on May 1.

Historical Society Director Bill Tennant presented the award to Patience Rogge, representing the Friends, and cited the program's efforts to preserve this important part of Jefferson County's heritage. In his remarks, Tennant noted that:

"The Fort Worden Oral History Program began as a part of the Fort's centennial celebration in 2002 as a project of the Friends of Fort Worden. It was organized by **Laurie Medlicott**, now a member of the Port Townsend City Council, with help from several volunteers. Fort Worden partnered with the Library of Congress American Folklife Center's Veterans History Project, which is building a nationwide database of information about people who have served in America's wars. When the centennial ended, the corps of volunteers kept the program alive."

In February of 2003, **Patience Rogge** took over running the program. Its objective is to collect oral histories to be taped, transcribed, archived, and made available for students, genealogists, writers, and historians. The entire collection tells of the real life experiences of those who served at Fort Worden during the military era; who worked or lived there during the Juvenile Diagnostic and Treatment Center days; or have visited, participated in activities, or worked at the fort since it became a state park conference center. **Val Didjurgis** undertook the huge task of archiving the interviews and photos, manuscripts and other memorabilia that people donated using the State Parks' Past Perfect program. **Margot Peart** offered to transcribe all the military interviews, which at that time numbered about 80. In 2007, **Andrea Barberi** offered to transcribe, catalog and

index the entire collection. In the past nine years, volunteers have donated hundreds of volunteer hours, mailed out hundreds of information packets, scheduled scores of interviews, and collected more than 300 oral histories. In addition to inperson interviews, they conduct telephone interviews, so people all over the world are within their reach.

In 2007, the program issued its first publication *Conversations with the 369th*, a catalog of interviews with members of the U.S. Army 369th Engineer

Amphibious Support Regiment who served at Fort Worden during the Korean War era. Their stories are especially interesting, since many of the soldiers participated in the building of the US airbase at Thule, Greenland while others were sent to Camp Desert Rock, NV to take part in early atomic tests or to Bordeaux, France as part of a NATO exercise. Transcripts of all military era interviews to date have been digitized. Excerpts from the collection are posted on the Friends website www.FWfriends.org. Editing the transcripts is a continuing job. A collection of 100 excerpts will be published in 2013 to celebrate the centennial of Washington State Parks.
